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1. Overview

Advance Category Page is a Magento 2 extension developed by Magexweb that gives store owners full control over how product categories are displayed across the storefront. It replaces Magento's default, largely static category browsing experience with a configurable, SEO-friendly category catalogue, adds a dedicated Categories landing page, enriches the native category page with a subcategory showcase, and ships three ready-to-use widgets (Grid, List, and Slider) that can be dropped into any CMS page, block, or layout via the standard Magento widget system.

The module is aimed at merchants with medium-to-large category trees (fashion, home goods, multi-brand marketplaces, B2B catalogs) who want visual, image-led category navigation without hiring a developer for every layout change.

1.1 Key Features

- Dedicated “All Categories” landing page with a merchant-defined URL, title, meta title/description, and rich-text top/bottom descriptions
- Three interchangeable display layouts: Grid, List, and Slider (carousel), selectable independently for the categories page, the subcategory section, and any widget instance
- Subcategory showcase automatically injected into the native Magento category view page (grid/list/slider), configurable per store view
- Dedicated Thumbnail Image field added to the category edit form (separate from Magento's native Category Image), with its own uploader and storage path
- Widget system integration — three CMS widgets (Grid/List/Slider) that content editors can place on any CMS page or block through the WYSIWYG “Insert Widget” button
- Fine-grained per-instance controls: parent category, sort order (name / ID / position), category exclusion list, category count limit, column count, product-count badge, child-category toggle, description/summary with configurable character length, and empty-category hiding
- Slider layout built on Owl Carousel with configurable loop, arrows, dots, autoplay, autoplay speed, and four responsive breakpoints (0 / 567 / 767 / 1023 px)
- Global module enable/disable switch and full store-view-level scoping for every setting
- Custom category list route registered through Magento's router pipeline, so the categories page works like any native CMS/catalog URL and respects the configured URL key

1.2 How It Works (Technical Summary)

The module is a standard Magento 2 component (Magexweb_Advancecategory) using the composer type magento2-module and PSR-4 autoloading. It contributes:

- A custom Router (Controller/Router.php) that intercepts the configured URL and forwards the request to a dedicated Index controller, rendering the categories landing page
- A CategoryPageSubcategory content block injected into the native catalog_category_view layout to render the subcategory grid/list/slider under the category description
- Three Widget blocks (Gridlayout, Listlayout, Sliderlayout) registered in etc/widget.xml for use anywhere Magento widgets are supported
- A preference on Magento\Catalog\Model\Category\DataProvider to expose the extra Thumbnail Image field on the admin category edit form, plus a dedicated upload controller and a virtual type for image validation/storage
- A System Configuration section (Stores > Configuration > Magexweb Settings > Advance Category Configuration) covering General, Category List, Category Page, and Category Widget groups

3. Installation

3.1 Composer Installation (Recommended)

1. Place the extension in your project (via private Composer repository, packagist, or by copying it under app/code).
2. From the Magento root, run the following commands:

Command	Purpose
composer require magexweb/advancecategory	Only if distributed via a Composer repository
php bin/magento module:enable Magexweb_Advancecategory	Registers and enables the module
php bin/magento setup:upgrade	Runs the module's data patch (adds the Thumbnail Image attribute) and schema updates
php bin/magento setup:di:compile	Recommended for production mode
php bin/magento setup:static-content:deploy -f	Required in production mode
php bin/magento cache:flush	Clears Magento cache

3.2 Manual (ZIP) Installation

- Copy the Advancecategory folder to app/code/Magexweb/Advancecategory in your Magento installation
- Run the same bin/magento commands listed in section 3.1 (module:enable, setup:upgrade, di:compile, static-content:deploy, cache:flush)
- Verify the module is active: php bin/magento module:status Magexweb_Advancecategory

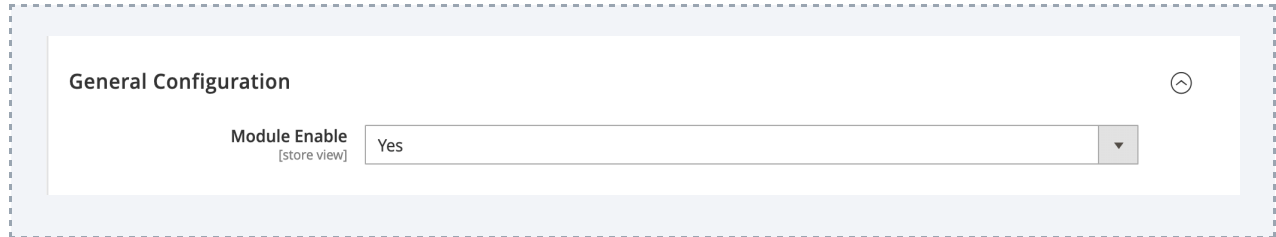
3.3 Post-Installation Checklist

- Go to Stores > Configuration > Magexweb Settings > Advance Category Configuration and confirm the section is visible
- Set Module Enable to “Yes” under General Configuration
- Configure the Categories landing page URL key and title
- Open any category in Catalog > Categories and confirm the new Thumbnail Image field appears in the Content section
- Visit the configured category list URL on the storefront to confirm the page renders

4.5 Category Thumbnail Image

The module adds a Thumbnail Image field to Catalog > Categories > [Category] > Content, alongside Magento's native Category Image. This lets merchants use a differently cropped/optimized image specifically for grid, list, and slider thumbnails without affecting the main category banner image used elsewhere in the theme.

6. Uninstallation

- `php bin/magento module:disable Magexweb_Advancecategory`
- Remove the module files (composer remove magexweb/advancecategory, or delete `app/code/Magexweb/Advancecategory`)
- `php bin/magento setup:upgrade && php bin/magento cache:flush`

Note: Uninstalling does not automatically remove the `category_thumbnail_image` attribute or previously uploaded thumbnail images; review Catalog > Attributes and the media storage before a full cleanup if required.

7. Troubleshooting & FAQ

The Categories landing page returns a 404

- Confirm Module Enable = Yes under General Configuration
- Confirm the Listing Page URL does not collide with an existing CMS page or catalog URL rewrite
- Flush cache and re-check under Stores > Configuration

Slider does not render / arrows and dots missing

- Confirm `requiresjs-config.js` is deployed (run `setup:static-content:deploy` again after any theme change)
- Check the browser console for a JavaScript conflict with another Owl Carousel version bundled by a different extension or theme

Thumbnail Image field is missing on the category edit page

- Re-run setup:upgrade to ensure the data patch that adds the attribute has executed
- Clear the generated/ and var/cache/ directories and re-check in production mode after di:compile8. Support & Changelog
